Caterpillars and Butterflies The Foundation Unit have been consolidating their social skills this week, building and den making outside to develop their team building skills. We have seen the children supporting one another and lining up to take turns. Inside, the children have been focussing on sounds in the environment, what sounds their bodies can make and listening carefully to sounds in words.

Class 1 We have used information from our trip last week to help us with our learning this week. We have been using the Knight's Tale story from our trip in our writing and have had a go at some new addition challenges in maths. We have made clay leaves to go with our clay trees and designed our own shields. Please remember P.E. kits on Monday and Thursday and encourage your child to read 5 times at home. @Allanolane



Class 2 This week we have been solving missing number problems and calculating and solving problems. Also, we have been creating some art work about our visit to the Royal Armouries. We have continued to read our class book of The Owl Who Was Afraid of the Dark.

Class 4 Another great week for Class 4, everyone has been really enthusiastic and produced some excellent work. In maths we have been ordering and comparing numbers into the thousands and in literacy we have been writing complex sentences. It's brilliant to see so many parents have joined class dojo. Access codes are still available for any who haven't.

Class 3 Class 3 have been doing subtraction this week, looking at subtracting 10s and 100s from 3 digit numbers. In Literacy, we have been adding inverted commas to speech so that we can have some dialogue between characters in the stories we create. We have also looked at Roman Gods and Goddesses and what rocks are natural or man-made. PE is every Monday and Thursday so ensure kit is school on these days and remember to read 5 times so you can come in non-uniform on Fridays.

Class 6 We have started morning boosters this week and have a regular committed group already - well done! Remember, the children who work hard and attend these sessions regularly will receive a special end of year treat. We have discovered how fossils are formed and examined some fossils.



Class 5 In Year 5, the children have been working hard to develop their skills of letter writing. They have been using language and contraction apostrophes to give their letters an informal tone. They are continuing to work hard to master dividing numbers using short division. You could help your child by encouraging them to learn their times tables and the related division facts so that they know them off by heart. Keep up the good work Year 5 – See you next week!
