


Coming Up

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Early Years



Nursery have had a great first week back to spring term. In Phonics we have begun to learn our phase 2 graphene 's'. In Maths we have begun to subitise the number 3. I wonder if your child can find 3 objects at home? During provision we have been exploring ice and investigating what happens to the ice when it gets warmer. In T4W we have started our new story ' Goldilocks and the Three Bears'. The children have been tasting different porridges, jam, golden syrup and plain.

Reception have come back into school, ready for learning and focused. In phonics we continue to review and have learnt the sound 'oo' (book) and continue to practice writing sentences. In Maths we have been learning about zero, subitising 0-5 and one less. In T4W sessions, children have been learning the text 'The Gingerbread Man' completing the story map to support their story telling. P.E. on Thursday has began a dance theme and started with dancing like animals!

We have had an amazing final week before our Christmas break! We had a wonderful craft session and a lovely Evergreen.






New year brings lots of positive things for some people - fresh starts, new challenges, goals and planning for the year ahead.
